Level 3 Certificate in Supporting Teaching and Learning in Schools

This qualification is suitable for teaching assistants, learning support assistants or those in a similar role at Level 3 and will provide learners with a secure understanding of the knowledge and skills needed when working directly with children or young people in school environments. The units cover child and young person development, safeguarding their welfare, the importance of equality, diversity and inclusion and supporting positive behaviour. They also cover communication and professional relationships with children, young people and adults, schools as organisations including types of schools, policies and procedures and the wider environment in which they operate, preparing for and supporting learning activities and supporting learners in the classroom, reflective practice and personal development. It will be internally assessed by a range of methods, including direct observations within the workplace, written assignments of tasks set by CACHE awarding organisation to build an e-portfolio of evidence.

Entry Requirements

Learners will need to be at least 19 years of age.

Learners undertaking the Certificate will need to be working or volunteering in a school environment that will allow you to be observed by an Assessor.

The course uses an electronic portfolio therefore it is essential for learners to have access to a computer and internet.

Learners will need to complete an initial assessment; this will include Literacy, Numeracy and ICT assessments and an interview.

The learners will be required to achieve a Level 2 in Literacy and a Level 1 in Numeracy and ICT.

Progression Route:

The Certificate includes units from the Level 3 Diploma in Specialist Support for Teaching and Learning in Schools and will enable you to directly progress into this qualification.
